



## **Welcome to the Care Guide for your Aurelion**

This simple guide will help you keep your Aurelion looking the same as the day it arrived. At HL, we use these same processes in-house to maintain showroom parts to our exacting standards.

### **Carbon Components**

The Aurelion's carbon has no exposed edges, but applying a protective wax coating will still enhance durability and maintain the deep gloss finish. This process is straightforward and ensures your Aurelion keeps its luxurious presence.

### **Brass Components**

The end caps and T-Pieces are precision-machined brass. Unless you have selected a plated finish (Nickel or Chrome), the brass is supplied raw and will naturally tarnish over time. Many owners value this aged character, but it can also be restored easily to a bright finish using the steps below.

### **Recommended Products**

- [Dodo Juice Black Widow Wax](#) – used in-house to protect and enrich carbon surfaces.
- [Menzerna Universal Polishing Cream](#) – safe for brass and cured resin.
- Four clean microfibre cloths (two for wax, two for polish).
- Gloves to avoid oils/grease contaminating the brass.
- Cotton buds for cleaning detailed engravings.

### **Process**

#### *Brass Components*

1. Apply a small amount of Menzerna polish to a microfibre cloth.
2. Work the polish into the brass components in firm circular motions.
3. Wipe clean with a fresh cloth.
4. Optionally, apply a thin coat of wax to the brass for additional protection, wiping clean once hazy.
5. For engraved areas, use a cotton bud to clear any excess polish or wax.

## *Carbon Surfaces*

1. Apply a thin layer of Black Widow wax across the carbon surfaces using a microfibre cloth.
2. Allow the wax to haze, then wipe clean with a second cloth to reveal a deep gloss finish.

### **Final Note**
